NIMROD

Nimrod was the initiator of the civilizations of Assyria and Babylon (Gen. 10:6-12). These two civilizations are responsible for destroying God's kingdoms – Israel and Judah in 605 BC. Judah was the southern kingdom, where Daniel lived during the hostile takeover. As our story reveals, Daniel and his friends were taken to the palace of the Babylonian king Nebuchadnezzar.



THE GOLDEN HEAD

Nebuchadnezzar built the most famous capital city the world has seen to date. At the time, it encompassed over two thousand acres. Folks that is a massive city. What Nimrod attempted to build upward; Nebuchadnezzar built horizontally. The walls around this fortress were 56 miles in length, 320 feet tall, and so broad that a four-horse chariot could comfortably walk on top of the wall. This city was considered impenetrable.

BROKEN UP








NEBUCHADNEZZAR LET IT
